## THE TURNAROUND MAN

IIM Rohtak is now amongst the top management research institutions in the country. IIM Rohtak was struggling like many new institutions with a downward trajectory when its turnaround started three years ago. The man behind all of this Prof Dheeraj Sharma.

n a time where we hear about institutional profligacy, one institution that has emerged as a exceptional institution while managing its resources optimally is Indian Institute of Management Rohtak. Since, early 2000s government has started dozens of IIMs, IITs, and AIIMs most of them struggling to attain some importance and many languishing in rented buildings. IIM Rohtak is only institution which is fully functioning out of its beautiful 200 acre campus with increased capacity of nearly 300% in last three years while enjoying 100% placement for it graduates. Also, IIM Rohtak is now amongst the top management research institutions in the country. Prof Sharma was a Professor in IIM Ahmedabad before joining HM Rohtak where he was also responsible for managing the Armed Forces Program (AFP). In 2017, IIM Ahmedabad's AFP program experienced one of the biggest growth in its placement statistics with majority of the candidates finding jobs to their satisfaction. Lt Cmdr Raj Kumar (Retd) who was the coordinator of the placement committee says "Armed Forces Program at IIMA is for resettling retired or retiring defence officers where placement was minimal. However, in 2016-17 the armed forces batch was not only expanded but also we had the best placement results ever. Prof Sharma was instrumental in projecting the Program to the industry and for our placement success." Besides, Prof Sharma also provided an important report to ministry of defence on review of officer selection process in armed forces of India which is likely to further strengthen quality of officer intake in defence services. Lt General Sanjeev Anand (former commandant of Indian Military Academy) says "Prof Dheeraj Sharma carried out a very insightful Study on Selection of Officers for the defence forces in 2014, which benchmarked major areas of concern. The study was aimed at streamlining and strengthening the selection process while reducing time lines for the selection process, itself."

In 2017, Prof Sharma was also appointed to the board of IRCTC (Indian Railway) where financial health of the organization had immediately taken a beating due to removal of booking surcharge which was a major source of revenue for the company. The company had a major turnaround and is now amongst

"Prof Sharma's guidance as a board member was the critical reason for us in improved branding, distribution, and appropriate human resource management at Milkfed. Implementation of the recommendations of this report has helped in addressing some of the important issues in the CAPFs and turning around the motivation level, and stress levels in CAPFs." Prof Sharma also helped JK Police deal with the issue of public confidence in Law and Order agencies. Mr. V K Singh (IPS and ADG JK police) says "Prof Sharma visited almost all areas in South Central KASHMIR and his inputs were valuable in perception management and contributed to various steps that were taken to enhanced public confidence in police."

Nowat IIM Rohtak one can witness first hand that not only has the institution growing stature but continue to expand in terms of number of student and number of programs. While several institutions are complaining about the impact of economic condition on student placements, IIM Rohtak has yet again done 100% placement with even opted out students getting more than 10 interview opportunities.
